


How I differentiated my personification lesson to meet the diverse needs of my 7th-grade ENL/ELA students...



Tiered Assignments!

<u>Tiered assignments</u> are tasks that vary by challenge level, complexity, outcome, process, product, or resources to accommodate different student needs and learning styles.

Tiered Question Samples

Section 1: Content Building

Each section received a tailored set of questions designed to meet their individual needs and challenging them when needed.







- 1. **Accommodates diverse language skills**: Tiered assignments allow ELLs to work on tasks that are tailored to their language proficiency level, providing an opportunity for them to demonstrate their understanding in a way that is manageable for them.
- 2. **Builds confidence**: ELLs can experience a sense of accomplishment and build confidence in their abilities, which can help to <u>alleviate anxiety and frustration</u>.
- 3. **Fosters critical thinking**: Tiered assignments can help ELLs develop critical thinking skills by requiring them to analyze and apply complex concepts at their own level of proficiency, rather than being overwhelmed by material that is too challenging.
- 4. **Promotes fluency:** by gradually being exposed to more demanding language structures and vocabulary.
- 5. **Supports vocabulary development:** learn vocabulary in context, as they are exposed to words and phrases at their own proficiency level
- 6. **Enhances comprehension:** they are able to focus on the content rather than struggling with the language.
- 8. **Encourages collaboration:** When ELLs work on tiered assignments, they can collaborate with peers who share similar language proficiency levels, fostering a sense of community and peer support.
- 9. **Enhances assessment and feedback:** provide teachers with a more accurate assessment.
